

Oral questions

- 2. Complete the following proof of the theorem stating that the sum of the angles of a triangle ABC is 180^{o} . We draw parallel line to AB through C and use the notation introduced in the picture.



Applying Euclid's fifth postulate to the line AC and the angles $180^o - \alpha$ and α' yields $180^o - \alpha + \alpha' \ge 180^o$. As a consequence we must have $\alpha' \ge \alpha$. Similarly, applying Euclid's fifth postulate to the line BC and the angles $180^o - \beta$ and β' yields $180^o - \beta + \beta' \ge 180^o$, and so $\beta' \ge \beta$. Hence we obtain

$$\alpha + \beta + \gamma \le \alpha' + \beta' + \gamma \le 180^{\circ}$$
.

Use Euclid's fifth postulate directly in two more situations to show that $\alpha + \beta + \gamma$ is also greater than equal to 180°.
