

# Project for ECGR5101 in Cooperation with ECGR5090 (RTT)

Fall 2014, Version 1.1

It is expected that students registered for 5101 will do an additional project, to scope of which is agreed-upon by the instructor. The projects can be done individually or by teams of two students. There is a special opportunity to do something with the ECGR5090 Research Tools and Techniques Course. The deliverables include the following.

- A write-up on the proposed work, format according to the ECGR5090 Requirements. You should talk to the instructor BEFORE you decide on a project. You will be graded on content and proper use of English. **September 26, uploaded to Moodle2.**
- A report on initial activity of the project, including biographical references, code listing, designs, etc. You will be graded on content and proper use of English. You also will be graded on content and progress made. **October 24, uploaded to Moodle2.**
- Draft of the final paper showing progress so far, format according to the ECGR5090 Requirements. You will be graded on content and proper use of English. You also will be graded on content and progress made. NOTE: The work does not need to be done yet, but the final results should be imminent. **November 17, uploaded to Moodle2.**
- A final paper report activity of the project, format according to the ECGR5090 Requirements. Code listing, designs, etc. should be in separate documents. You will be graded on content and proper use of English. **December 5, uploaded to Moodle2.**

Note that Dr. Conrad and Dr. Sass will not provide materials for this exercise, unless you select a project that they specifically request you to complete.
