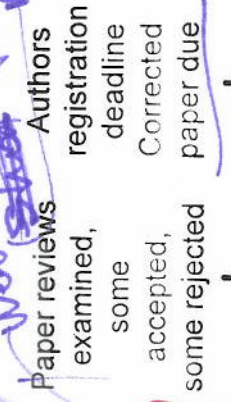
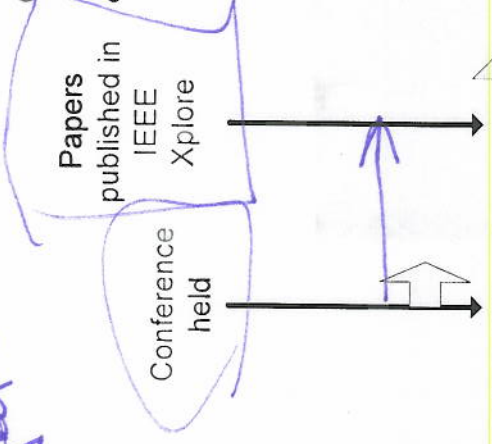

# Conference Paper Publishing Timeline

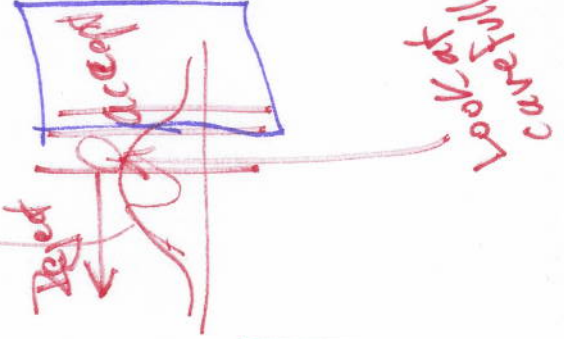
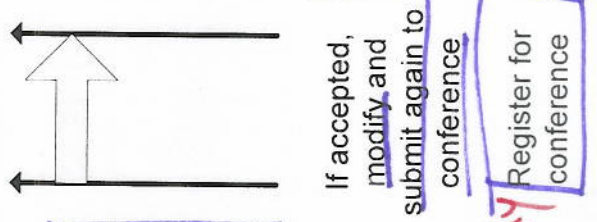
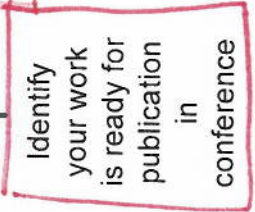
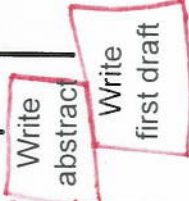
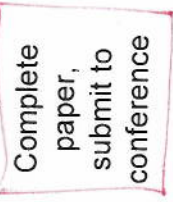
